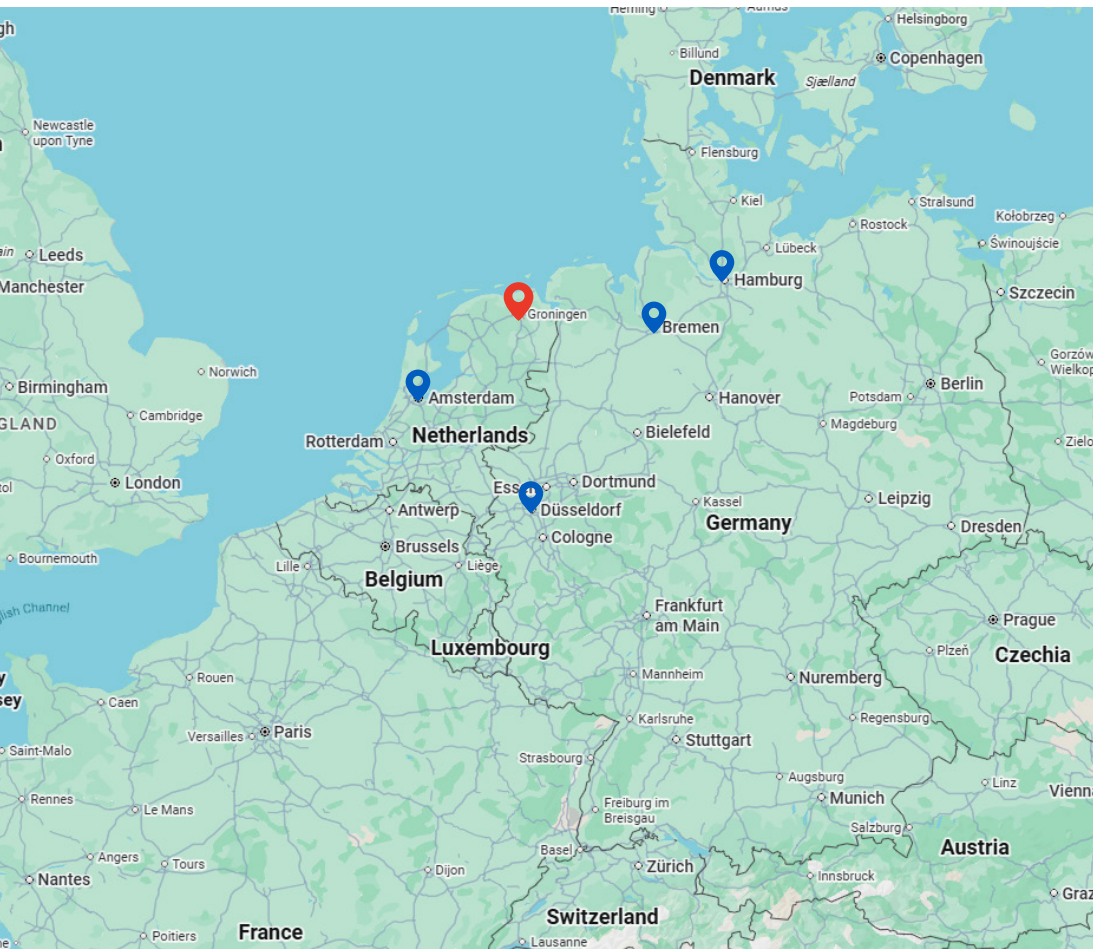

You can also travel to Groningen from various cities across Europe (for example, Berlin, Paris, and Brussels); check [NS International](#) for more information



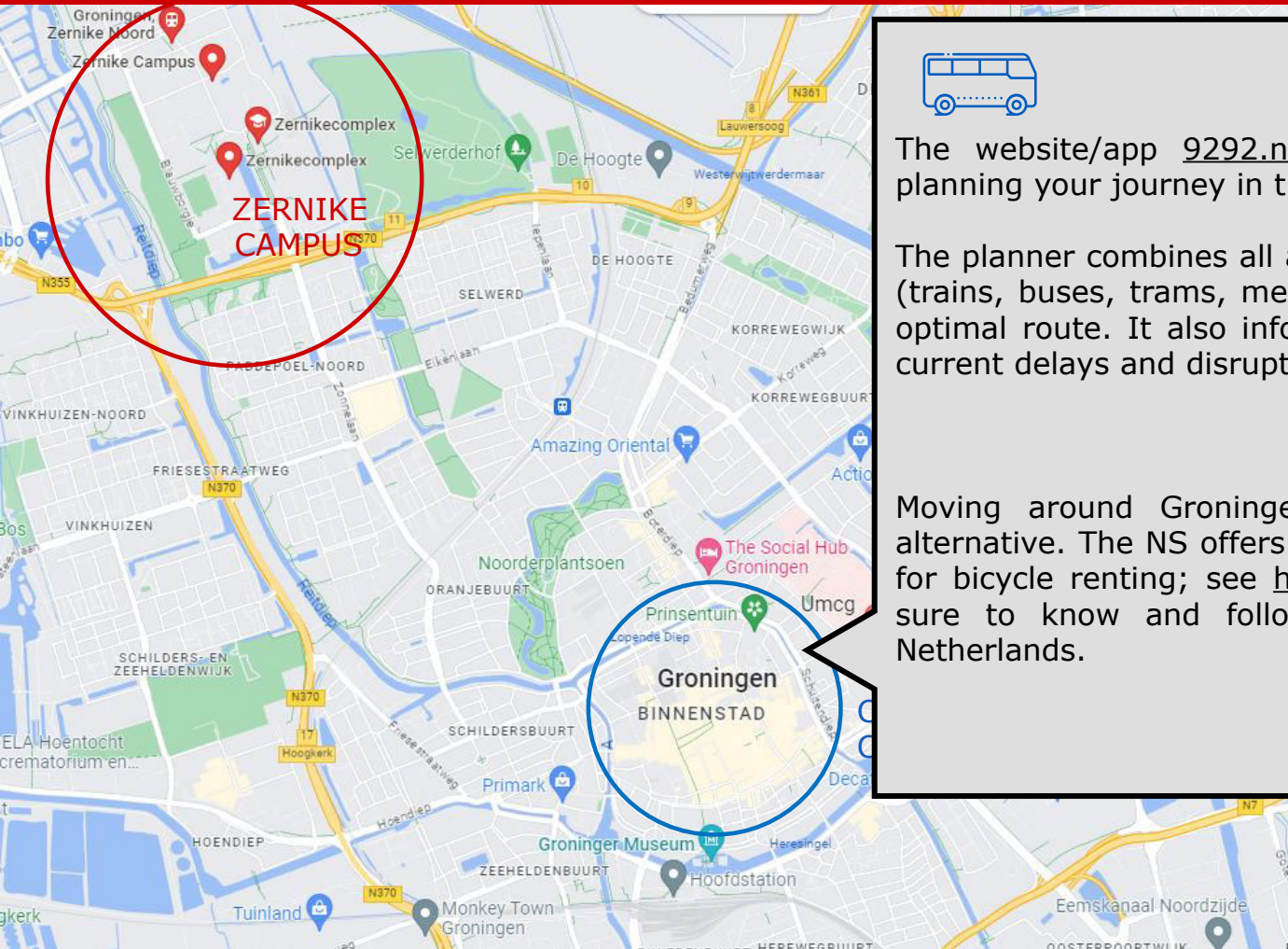

The planner combines all available public transportation (trains, buses, trams, metro, and boats) to provide an optimal route. It also informs you real-time about the current delays and disruptions in public transportation.

Sightseeing in Groningen



If you would like to do some sightseeing of our beautiful city, a great place to start is the iconic Martinitoren, where you can climb the tower for panoramic views over the city. The Martinitoren is located on the Grote Markt which is surrounded by cafés and historic buildings.

For culture lovers, the striking modern building of the Groninger Museum which is located accross from the Groningen Trainstation, offers diverse exhibitions ranging from contemporary art to local history. If you enjoy exploring on foot, wander through the picturesque streets around the canals or relax in the peaceful Noorderplantsoen. The Noorderplantsoen is a popular green park with walking paths, a Cafe called "Zondag" and often has open-air events.

If you have the means and the time, you could also venture into the province of Groningen and visit the North Sea wadden, the centuries-old Fraeylemaborg estate in Slochteren, or Fortress Bourtange (est. 1742).

Whether you're interested in history, art, shopping, or simply enjoying the atmosphere on a terrace, Groningen offers a charming and dynamic experience for every visitor.

(tip: when you arrive at the Groningen Trainstation, go into the main building and look up at the ceiling)
